

Description of activity / hazard

Sunday Worship is the most important gathering in the church week. It sees large numbers of people meeting together in the church building to praise and worship the Lord.

In the year 2020, the Covid 19 pandemic arrived in the UK prompting a Government lock-down. Gradually the restrictions were eased and churches were allowed to meet-up again, providing a valid Risk Assessment is in place that is in line with Government guidelines.

Covid 19 is a respiratory viral pathogen which causes serious disease. It is thought to be transmitted via airborne droplets and through contact with contaminated surfaces. In order to protect from this disease, the Government have released a series of guidelines which this Risk Assessment will apply to Sunday Worship meetings at Great Harwood Christian Fellowship.

On the 19th July 2021, the Government lifted their legal requirements for creating a Covid 19 safe environment and have replaced them with recommendations.
